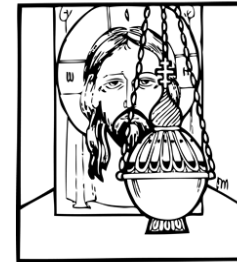

A Note from Fr. Anthony

Dear parishioners,

There will be no Tuesday liturgy this week due to a conflict in my schedule.

This upcoming Saturday marks 3 events.

First, we are beginning monthly First Saturday Divine Liturgies at St. George. Confessions will be heard from 7:45-8:15am prior to 8:30am Divine Liturgy, and afterwards if needed. Our Lady of Fatima appeared in 1917 requesting these devotions, and she was speaking to all Catholics!

This particular First Saturday also marks the beginning of the Dormition Fast. This fast goes from August 1st to 14th. This fast dates to the 5th century and traditionally was meant to be treated as strictly as the Great Fast. No meat and dairy were to be consumed the whole time, fish only on the feast of the Transfiguration, and oil and wine on weekends and the Transfiguration only. Technically speaking this fast is optional, but it is a part of our tradition and at the very minimum, it is recommended to abstain from meat on Wednesdays and Fridays. It is a good opportunity to challenge oneself as it is a short fast.

The first day of the fast we will celebrate the feast of the Procession of the Cross and the Minor Blessing of Water at our First Saturday Liturgy. This is a secondary Holy Water blessing that serves basically as a "backup" to the Theophany Water Blessing.

During fasting seasons we devote ourselves to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. I encourage everyone to attend our Third Annual Days of Prayer for Fallen Away Catholics next week. There will be opportunities for Confessions and the Mystery of Holy Anointing as we welcome several guest homilists. We also will be celebrating the Solemn Holy Day of the Transfiguration complete with the blessing of grapes and fruits.

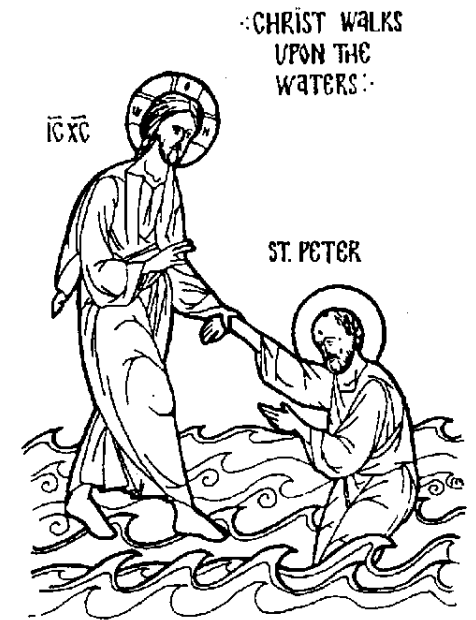

But the fact is that we cannot see as God does; if we too could judge events from the perspective of eternity, we would come to understand that God seeks for us a higher destiny, and a place of true serenity and provision for our deepest needs.
